



Samaritan Counseling Center Hawai'i Community Impact Report 2016

Our mission is to provide professional and accessible counseling sensitive to the spiritual traditions of individuals, families, and communities in Hawai'i.

Mahalo for helping us achieve an amazing year. In 2016, we served 215 clients through 1,684 counseling sessions and performed five clergy assessments. Our team was comprised of ten compassionate and licensed counselors, as well as three part-time support staff and an engaged volunteer Board of Directors.

Strategic Vision

We continue to embrace our Strategic Plan, which ensures that we are financially stable and can offer interfaith counseling services regardless of a client's ability to pay. We received our Full Accreditation from the Samaritan Institute for 2014-2018, which attests to the quality of our counselors and programs. We also improved our operations efficiency by transitioning to electronic medical record-keeping and billing.

Client Assistance Fund

Our Client Assistance Fund (CAF) subsidized 116 clients (54%) who were uninsured, under-insured, elderly, or low-income, through 319 counseling sessions (19%).

Community Outreach

We led five "Understanding and Preventing Domestic Abuse" workshops in March and two "Learn the Signs: Suicide Can Be Prevented" seminars in June and July. We also co-sponsored the "Soul Shop: Ministering to Suicidal Desperation" workshop in August, engaging 48 interfaith community leaders.


Ho'omenemene Dinner


Fundraising
